Commissioning Our New Stephen Ministers

Over a year ago our consistory encouraged our congregation to make the bold decision to become a more caring congregation by adopting the Stephen Ministry program. Since then we have recruited and provided training for 2 Stephen Leaders, who then recruited and provided training for 4 Stephen Ministers, as well as enlisting prayer partners for each. God has truly blessed us by multiplying our ministry through the Stephen Ministry program! But what is the next step?

On Sunday morning, February 12, our congregation will commission our new Stephen Ministers. Throughout history, when God has called people to special ministry, members of their community have commissioned them for the important new work they are taking on. Now we invite you to help carry on that biblical tradition by being a part of commissioning those who have responded to God's call to be part of our congregation's Stephen Ministry.

Our Stephen Ministers have already completed substantial training to equip them for this task. They have met on a weekly basis for 6 months, learning how to care for others more effectively, and have attended 2 retreats (the last one scheduled for Feb. 3-5 at Camp Fowler). Deep change has taken place in their minds and hearts. We now lay hands on them, pray for them, and send them out to minister, asking for God's blessing and the Spirit's wisdom and power.

This commission service offers an opportunity to show our support for this ministry. Our Stephen Ministers will be depending on our support in the time ahead as they assume the duties of their ministry. How can we help?

First of all, we can continue to pray for our Stephen Leaders (Pat Brooking and Linda Jacobs), our Stephen Ministers (Art Marshall, Marion Stephenson, Carolyn Whipple, and Deb Young), and their care receivers. This ministry calls for both time and effort. At times they may feel tired, discouraged, or convinced that they are not accomplishing anything. The assurance of our prayers and appreciation will help them keep moving forward.

We can also affirm and show our appreciation for this valuable ministry. We can tell them how much their hard work means to us, tell others how much we value our Stephen Ministry, and focus attention on our Stephen Ministers and Stephen Leaders to bless them and affirm them in special ways – as we will do in the commissioning service.

We can become involved in this ministry in many ways. Some of us may recognize a call to use our special gifts in this ministry and may apply to be a Stephen Leader or Stephen Minister. Others may accept the care of a Stephen Minister. We can help by watching for people in need and suggesting a Stephen Minister's care. We all can give our enthusiastic support by keeping Stephen Ministry always before us and by praying for and affirming those who have answered God's call to serve in this way.

As we commission our newly trained Stephen Ministers, let us thank God for all that they will bring to this congregation in providing care to others, and let us promise them our daily prayer and support as we send them out to minister among us!

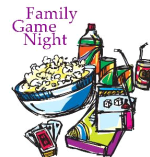
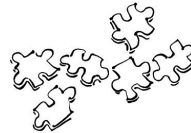

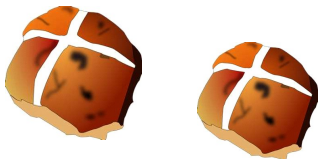


FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Feeding the poor is a ministry that Jesus has called the church to faithfully perform as a sign of God's love, and one that our congregation has participated in for the past 9 years through our Haven of Hope food pantry! Jesus also prayed that the church would be one.

Praise God for providing 3 new ecumenical partners for our food pantry ministry, which is now located in the storefront of 10 West Main St. in Fonda! Over the last 2 months members from F-F United Methodist Church, St. Cecilia's, and Sacred Heart have been training with and learning from our volunteers on how to staff the food pantry. Beginning this week, each partner church will share in this vital ministry by providing volunteers, food, and finances on a monthly basis.

Fonda Reformed Church will staff the pantry every 3rd Tuesday of the month from Noon until 2:00 p.m. Please continue to show your support for this ministry by dropping off non-perishable food items in the grocery cart located in the downstairs atrium. And pray that our witness to this community will be strengthened through these exciting partnerships with our neighbor congregations.

A Conversation About Conversations

with Josh Baron, Karen Patterson, and David Patterson



As you have hopefully already heard, our congregation has been actively participating in the denomination-wide discernment process and discussion that will help shape the Reformed Church of America's mission over the next decade.

At the worship service on January 1st our congregation reflected on 3 important questions related to this process: What is God doing within you? What is God doing through you? And what is God doing ahead of you? Then, on January 22 we were blessed to have one of the RCA's trained facilitators, Ellen Ratmeyer, lead us in a table-discussion based on our reflections on those 3 questions. The next step in this mission-discerning process will be a denomination-wide gathering in Orlando, Florida on February 10-12 called *Conversations*, where members of the RCA from all over the world will share what God is doing within, through, and ahead of their particular congregations. Our congregation has decided to send Rev. Karen Patterson, our Director of Music, to represent us. Another of our members, David Patterson will also participate as a member of the General Synod Council. We recently had a conversation about this upcoming *Conversations* event. Here's what Karen and Dave had to say! And please remember to pray for them, as well as the more than 500 other participants who will gather on February 10!

Josh: What is one thing that has stuck out to you the most as we've been reflecting on and responding to these 3 questions?

Karen: It's good to hear the variety of ways God is at work in people's lives. Yet I'm struck by the fact that without this exercise, we may not have shared those reflections with anyone or maybe even done an intentional self-reflection. As a church, how can we encourage and do this more?

Dave: Hearing and reading so many answers made me realize how interrelated these three areas are. Sometimes as God works in people He is also working through them, and vice versa. Seeing how God is working ahead of us is the hardest, but many answers related to God preparing opportunities, which again comes back to God working in and through people to make those opportunities happen. It seems, though, that unless we consciously look for God's hand in things, it's too easy to miss God at work until we take the time to look back in hindsight.

Josh: What are you especially looking forward to at the Conversations event on Feb. 10-12?

Karen: I'm looking forward to hearing the stories of how God is working in so many churches! I'm also curious to find out what will be common themes among us because that will help determine where God is leading for the future.

Dave: As is the case at General Synod, a gathering of so many people from across the RCA, even though the RCA is still just a small piece of God's worldwide church, broadens my perspective of the church. I look forward to being challenged to be more aware of God at work and to "think outside the box" by hearing about how people and churches in very different ministry contexts are following God's leading. I think it's important, too, to share about our experience at Fonda Reformed Church, since we are sharing that perspective, which may be "outside the box" to other people.

Josh: How do you think Fonda Reformed might benefit by having 2 of our members attend this important event?

Karen: Bringing the insights and learnings back to Fonda will be easier when two have attended, plus having two different perspectives will hopefully be a benefit.

Dave: Practically speaking, it gives us a voice in the process through which the RCA will discern where denominational resources should be focused in the next 5-10 years. Even more, though, I hope it creates spiritual growth in our church by helping us be more aware of God's work. I don't want this to be some denominational event that comes and goes and nobody thinks about again, as we just continue on doing the same things we've always done. Having the connection point of Karen and I attending will keep this "conversation" going for a while longer in our church, so that people will be more likely to think about what God is doing and what they should do in relation to that.



RCA Missionary Update

from the Fords



Our congregation has supported the mission efforts of the Ford family with our prayers and finances for several years as they faithfully serve God in Limuru, Kenya. They recently sent this report to all of the congregations who support them. As you read it, lift these missionaries up in prayer!

2011 Yearly Report to Supporting Churches from the Fords

Peter teaches courses in Islam and Christian-Muslim Relations (ICMR) at St. Paul's University, for Christian graduate students coming from various African countries. Patty coordinates the satellite Diploma in Theology program for outlying Bible schools affiliated with St. Paul's University.

Over the past year, how have you seen God working in your ministry? Please share both the progress and the setbacks with respect to your ministry goals. Please include your joys, challenges, and/or disappointments.

Peter's time continues to focus on African Christian students who are doing in-depth study of Islam and Christian-Muslim relations. Together, they seek to understand how the church in their home countries can work with Muslims to foster peaceful relations, and how Christians can present a faithful yet respectful witness to their faith in Jesus Christ. Peter has seen many students grow in this way, coming from countries such as Sudan (both north and south), Rwanda, Tanzania, Madagascar and Senegal – as well as Kenya. Peter has also worked on other related projects. He is chairing a committee at St. Paul's University which is preparing a detailed proposal for a major revision of the ICMR masters program; it will be expanded to include other concentrations within the field of Religious Studies, such as "Religion and Missions" and "Religion, Conflict and Reconciliation." This involves many hours sorting through government requirements, as well as differing perspectives among the staff. Another project was his participation in a major symposium last June on "The Qur'an and Contemporary Issues" held at the University of Nairobi. This allowed him to interact with many Muslim scholars from the region, several of whom had never met a Christian scholar of Islam before. Patty has been able to make significant improvements to the satellite Diploma in Theology program. She coordinated a major revision of the Diploma in Theology syllabus and has worked to improve communication between the outlying colleges and the theology faculty at St. Paul's University. Sometimes the work is frustrating when key contributors don't follow through on time with the writing or marking of exams, etc. But the overall structure of her job is much improved from when she took it over two years ago, and her Kenyan supervisors have appreciated her important contribution.

Share any physical or spiritual health issues that have impacted your ministry during this past year.

We continue to thank God for excellent health. We continue to exercise daily, and we participated in RCA's "Amazing Pace" program, almost always beating the daily average of steps walked. In addition to personal and family devotions, Sunday worship and campus chapels, we participate each week in a small campus fellowship which has helped to bring us closer to our Kenyan colleagues as true brothers and sisters in Christ.

Briefly discuss any goals, dreams, and/or changes you would anticipate in your ministry for the coming year.

The major upcoming event this year will be our six-month Home Assignment, from late June to December. One goal will be to help Andrew transition from high school here to college life in the U.S. Our major ministry during those months will be to visit as many of our supporting churches as possible. We look forward to seeing you all in person after several years of ministry on this side of the globe!

Share any specific project related needs and other ways supporting churches might be able to assist you.

In recent years, the income from our supporting churches has not been able to keep up with the increasing expenses of our budget. The difficult economy has forced some congregations to reduce or withdraw their contribution towards our support. Currently our support level is down by six PIM shares (Partnership in Ministry). We hope that our personal visits this year will encourage some churches who are able, to help reduce this deficit through an increase in their giving. We also hope to visit new churches who might be interested in becoming support partners.

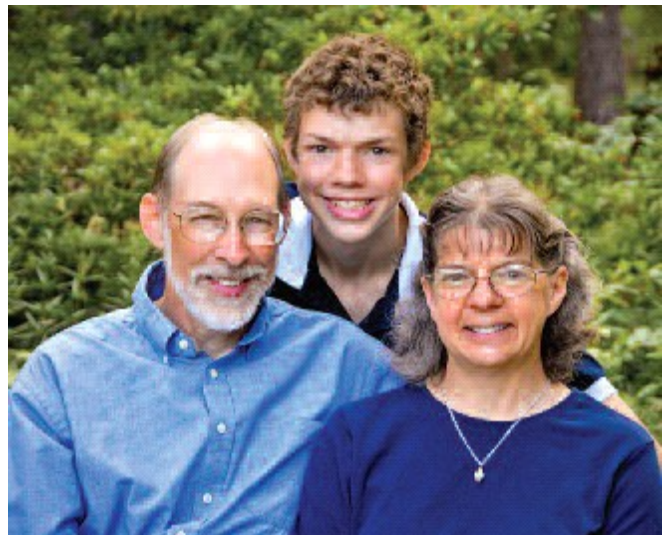
Please tell us about ongoing as well as special prayer needs you may have at this time.

We ask your prayers especially for Andrew as he graduates from Rosslyn Academy in May. He has spent his entire life in Africa except for short summer visits to the U.S. He sometimes comments that he feels more African than American! But he is excited to embark on his college studies in the field of Animation, and he is glad to be able to do this at a reputable Christian school (Regent University in Virginia Beach). Otherwise, we invite prayer for safety as we travel many miles during our Home Assignment, and for positive visits with you, our supporting churches and friends. We would also invite your prayers as we seek to comfort several faculty colleagues and families who have lost family members during the last year, and who continue to grieve over their loss. One of our teachers died of cancer, leaving behind a widow and eight children (three their own, five orphan nieces and nephews); two colleagues lost young children, and one a son-in-law.

In one sentence, please thank all those who pray and support you and your RCA ministry.

Some of you have journeyed with us throughout our nearly 30 years of RCA missionary service, while others have come on board more recently – yet all of you are equally important in this kingdom task, and without you our life's vocation overseas would have been impossible. So thank you one and all!
